Objectives

This sixth AALIANCE2 Stakeholder Workshop aims to consolidate the structure and contents of the first version of the AALIANCE2 Roadmap and Strategic Research Agenda produced during the first period of the Project and to probe and build on them new improved and enriched AALIANCE2 contents. Particularly, the Workshop will focus on the consolidation and identification of major AAL stakeholders' needs, societal and economic aspects and technology requirements and trends for AAL.

Participants

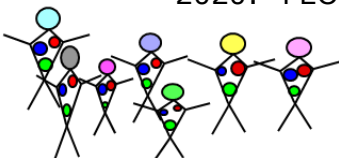

The People Olympics game is based on competing cities. Each city has a team of 10.000 participants, which reflect that city demographics. The members of the team track their physical activity through portable devices, which provide all the physiological data. A system collects all data and updates the real time cumulative fitness activities at city level, and compares it with the value of the other competing cities.

There is not only a physical benefit for people but the possibility of making more livable and enjoyable their city. People will be engaged in the creative development for improving their city wellbeing facilities and infrastructures (more cycling lanes; more jogging green areas, new routes for cultural sites, etc.).

The Platform supports the members to adopt a healthier, more active and co-creative behavior and to contribute to a collective action. The network will engage in Knowledge, Social and Business activities (KSB).

- ❖ The Knowledge scope of the network is to collect practices and generate new services ideas. Active behavior accrues the knowledge of the members.
- ❖ The Social scope is to nurture the local social capital of the network and to dramatically augment it by joint cross border initiatives;
- ❖ The Business/Benefit scope consists of the evaluation of the benefits accrued through community activities, at both individual and collective level.

The First Edition of the People Olympics games will take place in 2016, the same year of the Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro. Each team is constituted by 10.000 people, reflecting the demographics of its City.

Live trials by a core group of "Very Smart Cities" will start in 2014 with the objective of validating the games rules and the supporting ICT infrastructure. Each trial will involve at least 100 people.

Rump up pilots will be conducted during 2015 by all the cities wishing to participate to the People Olympics games. Each pilot will involve at least 1.000 people

The "People Olympics for Healthy Living" initiative will also form the basis for launching a major research and innovation project proposal in the HORIZON 2020 framework.

The European Commission has proposed a follow up to the Ambient Assisted Living Joint Programme (AAL JP) for 2014 – 2020, to continue the success of the present programme in applied research for ageing well with ICT. The aim of the AAL JP is to support industry, in particular SME to bring digital innovative products and services for ageing well to the European market.
